Yemen's economy used to be based on goods such as coffee and myrrh; later outcompeted because of the international division of labour.


South of Yemen was a British colony for 129 years; it was not until 1967 that the British Empire withdrew.

- PDRY was the only socialist republic in SWANA
- Aligned with the USSR and later on with China
- Supported the revolution in Oman



Oil was found in the east of the country in 1984 which transformed the economy.




RECENT HISTORY

Ansar Allah


- Translates into Partisans of God
- Began as a theological movement, yet faced repression from the US backed government
- Turned to arms in order to defend themselves
- Fought against Salafis such as al-Qaeda and Daesh
- Mostly formed as a reaction against imperialism, which has plundered Yemen heavily and de-developed it severely
- Domestically oppress Yemenis too, such as checkpoints, extensive arrests and the siege of Taiz

Imperialist Agression

- The US and its puppet states in the Gulf began their open aggression in 2015
- US-Saudi led naval blockade has been one of the main contributors to the famine
- US and UK-backed Saudi-led invasion has led to 370 thousand deaths
- Following Al-Aqsa flood, Yemen has begun firing missiles at the Zionist entity and has been blockading all ships from trading with the occupation
- 'In response' the US & UK have been bombing civilians and civilian centres (e.g., Sanaa airport)



Ansar Allah - Ansar al-Sharia - Islamic State - Saudi coalition



'What Brings You Here' explores themes of identity and belonging in the context of Jamme'a, a fisherman who unexpectedly emigrated from Somalia to Aden, Yemen at an early age.

Ozazah by Ala'a Hafed

'The film revolves around the life of an elderly woman called Aziza, known as Ozazah locally, who lives on Jabal Sabr (Mount Sabr), a key landmark in the city of Taiz.

Selahy (My Weapon) by Alaa Zabara

A short narrative film that follows a young deaf girl, Saleemah who has one major love in this world; her camera.


CW: Depiction of a bombardment and blood, very brief depiction of a dead animal.
